THE EGYPTIAN GOVERNMENT'S EFFORTS TO MAINTAIN MILITARY

RULE AFTER THE COUP BY ABDUL FATTAH AL-SISI

**ABSTRACT** 

The coup that occurred in 2013 by Abdul Fattah al-Sisi brought the

military rule back to power in Egypt. With great support from the society, al-Sisi

was elected as president. After officially elected as president of Egypt and

inaugurated in 2014, Al-Sisi immediately made efforts to maintain military rule.

Al-Sisi did two attempts on his administration, which were internal efforts and

external efforts. Internal efforts to overcome the problems in the country were not

yet stable because there were many protests. Al-Sisi issued the decrees, authorized

the new legislation, and trying to improve the Egypt's economy with the aid from

other countries. External efforts focused on finding support from other countries

and expanded the Suez Canal to attract foreign investors. This paper discusses
