SOS CHILDREN'S VILLAGE'S ROLE IN FULFILLING CHILDREN'S RIGHTS BASED ON UNITED NATIONS CONVENTION ON THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILDREN (UNCRC) IN INDONESIA

ABSTRACT

The Right of the Child is a human right directed to children put forward by the global community to save children displaced by the onset of World War. Rights of the child are then patented in the form of the Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). The issue of child rights is addressed not only by the governments of a country but also some international organizations. An example is SOS Children's Village. The purpose of this study is to find out how the role of SOS Children's Village in handling child rights cases and to encourage children's rights to children in Indonesia, as well as to determine whether the role of SOS Children's Village is in accordance with UNCRC. The method used in this research is descriptive research, the research procedure that produces descriptive data, in the form of written or oral words of the people and behavior that can be observed. While in the technique of collecting data using literature study and using descriptive data analysis techniques that describe, and summarize the various conditions, the situation of various data collected in the form of interviews or observations on the problems studied that occurred in the field.

Based on the research, SOS Children's Village roles can be gained in encouraging the fulfillment of children's rights in Indonesia and knowing whether the role is in accordance with what is written in UNCRC.
