Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk menganalisis pola pendapatan, pola prilaku dan jumlah konsumsi serta pola prilaku dan jumlah tabungan mahasiswa saat sebelum pandemi covid-19 dan selama masa pandemi covid-19. Penelitian ini merupakan penelitian deskriptif komparatif yang bertujuan untuk mendeskripsikan serta membandingkan variabel pendapatan, konsumsi, dan tabungan mahasiswa saat sebelum dan selama masa pandemi covid-19. Populasi dalam penelitian ini adalah mahasiswa Prodi Ekonomi Pembangunan Angkatan 2017-2018. Dengan teknik *Proportionate Stratified Random Sampling* jumlah sampel yang diteliti adalah sebanyak 170 orang. Instrumen dalam penelitian ini menggunakan angket yang disebar secara online. Teknik analisis yang digunakan adalah *Wilcoxon Signet Rank Test*. Hasil penelitian menunjukkan ada terdapat perbedaan jumlah rata-rata pendapatan, prilaku dan jumlah konsumsi, serta prilaku dan jumlah tabungan mahasiswa saat sebelum pandemi covid-19 dan selama pandemi covid-19 berlangsung.

ABSTRACT

This research aims to analyze income patterns, behavior patterns and the amount of consumption as well as behavior patterns and the amount of student savings before the Covid-19 pandemic and during the Covid-19 pandemic. This research is a comparative descriptive study that aims to describe and compare income variables, consumption, and student savings before and during the Covid-19 pandemic. The population in this study were students of the Development Economics Study Program 2017-2018. With the technique, the Proportionate Stratified Random Sampling number of samples studied was 170 people. The instrument in this study used a questionnaire distributed online. The analysis technique used is the Wilcoxon Signet Rank Test. The results showed that there were differences in the average amount of income, behavior and amount of consumption, as well as behavior and the amount of student savings before the Covid-19 pandemic and during the Covid-19 pandemic.
